COURSE DESCRIPTION

As cerebral vascular accidents (CVA) continue to be a leading cause of disability, clinicians and families search for research and techniques to improve function in the clients and loved ones in their care. This course will focus on current advances and practices that affect stroke rehabilitation. Lectures will highlight such topics as endovascular and surgical frontiers for intracranial aneurysm treatment, neuroplasticity, recognition and treatment of visual deficits and constraint-induced movement therapy. Breakout sessions will explain and describe bowel and bladder management following stroke, therapeutic application of yoga, impact of stroke on family and community environments, neuropsychological resources, driving after a CVA, cognitive and communication treatment techniques, and brain injury resources following CVA. All areas covered will provide participants with a substantial knowledge base in which to carry-over this information into everyday practice.

5. Define CI therapy and describe the theoretical bases for the approach.

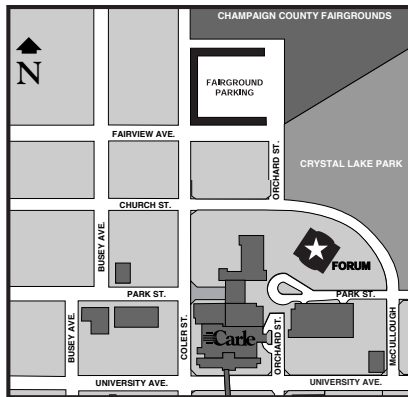
- Discuss results and clinical implications of research using CI therapy for motor recovery following stroke.
